QUALIFICATIONS:

All Intern candidates must be

- Pursuing a degree in Social Work, Psychology, Counseling Psychology, Mental Health Counseling, Human Services or other related field
- Proficient in Microsoft Office as well as using email and internet browsers
- Professional, effective communicators with staff and clients
- Available to attend required trainings, group supervision, and weekly individual clinical supervision
- Able to access reliable transportation with a valid driver's license and proof of current auto insurance

Acceptable CORI (Criminal Offender Record Information), OIG background check, driving record, and reference check are required. Internship hours are flexible; based on the availability of both the intern and clients. Evening or weekend hours are required. Clinical supervision and trainings are provided Monday through Friday, between the hours of 9:00 am - 6:00 pm.

GENERAL DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Dress appropriately and be punctual
- Communicate frequently with staff and supervisor regarding clients
- Complete client documentation as required
- Adhere to all agency policies and procedures
- Engage in culturally aware practices with all clients
- Attend internal and external trainings as required
- Keep a record of your service hours on the posted form at your program
- Perform other duties to be assigned based on degree level and professional interests
