

How to Talk so Little Kids Will Listen Playgroup & Parent Education Program For families with children age 3-5

In this group, we will read a portion of the book before each group and then have a chance to talk about key points with each other, ask questions, and get support, while children play amongst us in the playroom. 


Fall Storywalk

This group will meet on a fenced-in playground as much as long as weather permits, and at First Connections in Acton when it is raining and/or cold. Children will have a chance to play with balls, dig in the sand, and "cook"

First Connections' ParentChild+ program brings fun and engaging early learning experiences into your home at no cost to you! Each week an Early Learning Specialist visits bringing a high-quality book or toy that you keep. The specialist models reading, conversations, and play activities for parents, which are designed to promote language, literacy, and school readiness. The program is designed to begin with children ages 18-24 months and is offered for 23 to 46 weeks to families within our 11-town catchment area. Bilingual Spanish and Mandarin specialists are available. The program is especially helpful for families who cannot easily attend our playgroups due to lack of transportation, a language barrier, having multiple children under age 6, single parenting, or who are experiencing financial or other

First Connections Diaper Pantry Critical Need thru December

- Since January, we have assisted 29 families with their need for diapers; they can visit the pantry once a month.
- Our funds to purchase needed sizes are currently very low, and a new round of grants will not begin until January
- Families must register with us and qualify for WIC, SNAP, childcare subsidy, subsidized housing, or have other circumstances that make their financial situation unstable.
- As part of the registration process, we refer families to other benefits programs they may be eligible for.
- Some of our diaper pantry clients have enrolled in our PC+ home visiting program for more parent support and early learning activities for their children.
- Current pantry users live in 10 of our towns, speak 8 different languages and include 49 children.




