

DIAPER PANTRY CHANGES

Due to not having a confirmed funding source for our diaper pantry for 2025-26, we will be instituting some cost-saving measures for the next 6 months.

In June 2025, if we have not received a donation that will fund the pantry for another year, we will have to stop all diaper distributions.

Starting January 2025:

- 1) We will only be ordering Amazon brand diapers as they are the most reasonably-priced high-quality brand.**
- 2) We will no longer be able to order Pull-ups as they are twice as expensive as Amazon diapers.**
- 3) We will only be providing Amazon wipes.**

Sometimes we receive donations of Pampers, Huggies, Pull ups and other brands. If you ONLY want those brands let me know the size you need and I will email you if we receive any.

Diaper pantry can be visited every 30 days, where families in financial distress are provided with up to 1 week of diapers.
