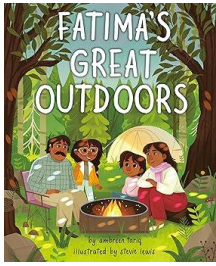


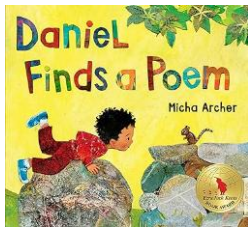
SPRING STORYWALKS



June 14-23 Codman Community Farm, 58 Codman Road, **Lincoln** Park at the farm and follow the storywalk while observing the animals and visiting the barn store if you choose to. There will be a Family Camp Out event going on June 14, 4:30 pm-June 15, 8:30 am to be aware of. This story is appropriate for preschoolers and early elementary kids, telling the story of Fatima and her family's first experience with camping in a tent while creating family memories.

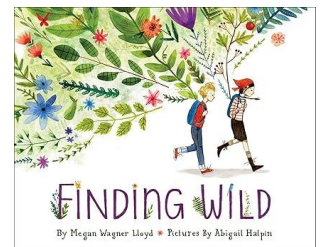
Community Storywalks

April 13-October 31 Robbins House, 320 Monument Street, **Concord**. *Ayo's Adventure* explains how African traditions in the U.S. and around the globe incorporate storytelling, connecting us to our shared heritage. Robbins House is a 2-family home built in the 1800's for the children of slavery survivor and Revolutionary War veteran Caesar Robbins. Admission is free. They are open every day 10-4:00. The parking lot is across the street from the Old Manse and Old North Bridge, part of Minuteman National Park.



May 4-25 Assabet River NWR, 680 Hudson Rd, **Sudbury** Daniel is on his way to discovering a poem of his own after spending time with his animal friends! This storywalk is sponsored by the Friends of Woodlands and Waters and the Assabet River National Wildlife Refuge. Admission is free sunrise to sunset. The walk begins outdoors near the Headquarters Bldg where there is a parking lot. It follows a stroller-friendly paved sidewalk for just over 1/4 mile. At the end of the walk you can choose to return by a woodland trail, making the whole loop about 3/4 mile.

Spring 2025 Wolbach Farm, 18 Wolbach Road, **Sudbury**. *Finding Wild* is the story of 2 children who leave their urban home to find the beauty of the natural world. The children eventually return home and realize that nature exists not just far away but also in their own back yard. 3/4 mile trail for families to walk while reading the story. Spring 2025 Gore Place, 52 Gore Street, **Waltham** *Fly Little Bird* is a bilingual English/Portuguese book telling the story of a little bird who loves the sky. He tries to fly but can never fly up more than a few feet. He is too afraid. So he watches the other birds fly into the sky and leave him. But then something strange happens... Read how the shy little bird overcomes his fears. The storywalk is set up next to the shaded Nature Playscape. Open dawn to dusk, free of charge. You can also walk over to see the Leicester Longwood Sheep near the barn of this country mansion.

June 20-27 Long Lake Park, **Littleton**. Littleton Public Library is putting up a “secret title” storywalk beginning at the Colonial Drive entrance. The Charles L.Tirone Trail is .65 miles long, a loop trail on the northwest side of Long Lake Park. It may be accessed from the trail head at the end of Colonial Drive. The trail is an easy walk along the wooded shoreline of Long Lake before returning to the parking lot along a portion of the AT&T Right of Way. At the end of Colonial Drive. a parking area constructed by the Town is on the left before Colonial Drive turns into a narrow dirt road. Walking down the dirt road will take you to Long Lake.
