A Note from Our Director

As we close out our 2024-25 fiscal year, I am reflecting on the incredible generosity of the community that supports this programming and ensures our services remain free of charge and accessible to all families. We are proud to be a 100% grant and donation funded program. Our dedicated, all part-time, staff work hard year-round to ensure we can keep playing, singing, reading, and supporting families.

We have been a Mass. Dept. of Early Ed and Care grant holder since the inception of Coordinated Family and Community Engagement grants nearly 30 years ago. Our yearly grant amount has not increased in the past 10 years, and now only covers approximately 60% of our budget. We are grateful to the ongoing support of generous foundations and community partners including Nordblum Family Foundation, Concord Carlisle Foundation, Schrafft Charitable Trust, Sudbury Foundation, Acton-Boxborough United Way, Maynard Community Chest, Acton Congregational Church, Concord Trinitarian Congregational Church, and more.

This year our diaper pantry has received generous support through diaper drives from Emerson Hospital, State Rep. Simon Cataldo, The Discovery Museum, Acton-Boxborough Family Network, and Acton Cooperative School, a donation from Neighborhood Villages, and, most importantly, through the generous contributions of our devoted community members.

Social Emotional Skills: Sorry, Not Sorry presented by Ellie Springer, M.Ed.

Go to any playground, story time, or playgroup, and you'll hear adults saying, "Say you're sorry!" to young children. And you may hear some very savvy children quickly say, "Sorry," and run off. But are they really sorry? What is the right thing to do when your child takes a toy or hits someone? If you have a toddler or preschooler and are wondering about this topic, come hear some of the reasoning behind not always making your child say they're sorry and what to do when your child hurts someone else - adult or child - on purpose or by accident.

Navigating the 4th Trimester

This quarterly workshop offers a supportive place for expectant parents to explore the physical, emotional, and relational challenges that accompany the first 3 months after birth. In this program you will learn evidence-based strategies to support your postpartum plan that include practical strategies for adjusting to life with a newborn, coping with challenges related to sleep and feeding, managing changes in your relationships, and nurturing your own wellbeing during this transformative time. Join us for this interactive session facilitated by lactation counselor and infant sleep consultant, Mary Beilman, who draws from over 20 years supporting new parents; and Emily Fiorini, LMHC, who specializes in infant and parent mental health and is First Connections' program director. Helpful postpartum community resources are included. Birthing person and a support person are welcome to attend free of charge. Summer Storywalks


Great Brook Farm, 165 North Road, Carlisle Saturday July 19 thru Tuesday, July 29


This is a great summer nature story with wonderful illustrations and a community-building ending.

Dogs are allowed, but not in the barn. \$3 car parking fee, or check out a Mass. State Parks pass at your library and it's FREE!






Hugh Cargill Community Garden, Concord Across from the Courthouse at 305 Walden Street Saturday, August 2 thru August 10

This bilingual English/Chinese story of a neighborhood of gardeners who realize the uncommon vegetables one family is growing can taste delicious! You can see all the different kinds of gardens growing here then get your coloring page and parent handout about the benefits of gardening with young children at the end of the story. A short distance down Walden Street (across from the High School) is Hapgood Wright Town Forest with free parking. You can visit **Fairyland Pond**, which is a 20-minute loop (yellow trail).

6-Wk Summer Playgroups Begin July 7



Ages and Stages Playgroup for Babies 6-15 Months Held at Littleton Library, Wednesdays, 10:30-11:30 This group meets at the Discovery Museum on July 30

In this playgroup, babies will have the chance to play with some age-appropriate toys to support their development, based on the Ages and Stages Questionnaire. Caregivers will also have a chance to check in with one another and the facilitator to share wins, ask questions, and get support for challenges. We will also sing songs and read a book each week. All caregivers are welcome, but please make arrangements for older siblings to keep little ones safe.

Ages and Stages Playgroup for Ages 12-23 Months Held at Maynard Public Library, Fridays, 10:30-11:30 This group meets at the Discovery Museum on August 1

In this group, children will have a chance to interact with one another and with materials and activities based on the Ages and Stages Questionnaire to support different areas of their development, as well as some of the library's new sensory play materials. We will have a circle time with songs and a story at the end of each meeting. Infant siblings in a carrier are welcome. Please make arrangements for care of older siblings to keep new walkers safe.

Ages and Stages Playgroup for ages 24-35 Months Held at First Connections, Acton, Thursdays, 10-11:00 This group meets at the Discovery Museum on July 31

In this playgroup, children will be able to play with all the toys in our playroom, including a play kitchen and baby dolls. Each week we will have an activity that will support an area of development based on the Ages and Stages Questionnaire, including some art and sensory activities. At the end of each meeting, we will have a circle time with songs and a book. Please dress your child in clothes that can get dirty. Infant siblings in a carrier are welcome. Please make arrangements for older siblings to keep the room from being too crowded.

Book Bag Literacy Playgroup for Ages 3 thru 5 Held at First Connections, Acton, Tuesdays, 10-11:15

This playgroup will meet in our playroom and is designed to support preschoolers in developing their early literacy skills. Each group will end with a circle time with songs and a book. Each family will borrow a bag of books to take home and read, then return them the following week to exchange for different books. Younger siblings welcome but be aware that there will be toys with small parts in the playroom.

Science & Nature Outdoor Playgroup for Ages 4 thru 6 Held at Farrington Nature Linc, Lincoln, Mondays, 10:00-11:00

In this group, we will explore Nature Linc's trails and all the plants and animals that live there. Trails ar<u>enot</u> stroller friendly, and everyone should dress appropriately for walks in the woods. Siblings are welcome, but please let us know who will be attending so we know whom to expect. We are grateful for support from the Learning Ecosystems Northeast project, led by Gulf of Maine Research Institute, and through our friends at the Discovery Museum, for making our visits to Nature Linc possible.




for your donations of 1,657 diapers and wipes this spring to help families using our diaper pantry! Your efforts are incredibly helpful in assisting families in our community make ends meet!

FREE 4-Session Parenting Class


