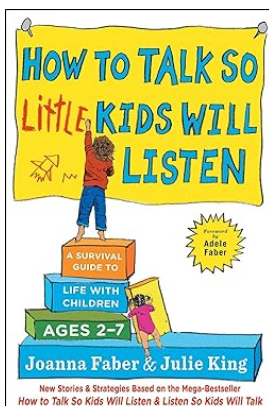

How to Talk so Little Kids Will Listen Playgroup & Parent Education Program For families with children age 3-5

In this group, the adults will discuss a portion of the book, ask questions, and get support, while children play amongst us in the playroom. Each session will end with a quick circle time for the children. Caregivers are welcome to attend on their own if their children are in school. Families with multiple children, including siblings under 3, are welcome. Infants should be held or in a carrier to keep them safe. All parents will receive a copy of the book (also available on Audible and through libraries as an audiobook, but we recommend using a hard or electronic copy due to images that would be hard to translate via audio). Nervous System Care for Parents, Caregivers and Educators presented by Chrissy Dagostino, M.A.

One of the most important pieces of feedback we received from those who attended Chrissy Dagostino's presentation on the Magic of Co-regulation between parents and children, was that parents would like a follow-up session on self-regulation for parents and caregivers. This is it!! Please join us as we welcome Chrissy back. She holds a M.Ed in Early Childhood & Special Education, and is Certified in Applied Educational Neuroscience and in The Powerfully You Self-Regulation Curriculum.

Toilet training can be a loaded topic with many questions! When is the right time to toilet train? Is my child on track? Where do we even start? This presentation will focus on preparing you and your child for potty learning/potty training and supporting individual potty needs. Parents will leave this presentation with a better understanding of what developmental milestones support potty learning and training, how to set up the environment to match your child's needs, what parents can do to help set themselves and their child up for success, and activity ideas to build potty skills. 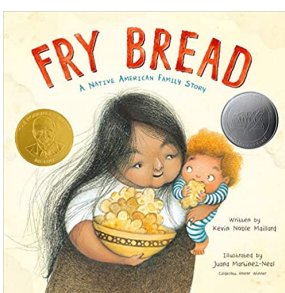
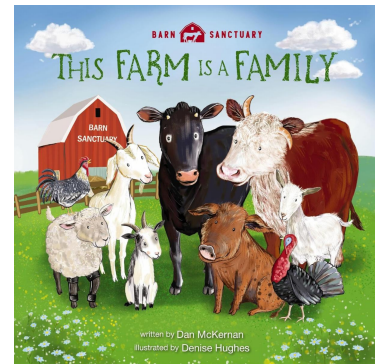


Free Fall Storywalks

First Connections' ParentChild+ program brings fun and engaging early learning experiences into your home at no cost to you! Each week an Early Learning Specialist visits bringing a high-quality book or toy that you keep. The specialist models reading, conversations, and play activities for parents, which are designed to promote language, literacy, and school readiness. The program is designed to begin with children ages 18-24 months and is offered for 23 to 46 weeks to families within our 11-town catchment area. Bilingual Spanish and Mandarin specialists are available. The program is especially helpful for families who cannot easily attend our playgroups due to lack of transportation, a language barrier, having multiple children under age 6, single parenting, or who are experiencing financial or other challenging circumstances. First Connections Diaper Pantry - Is Now 100% Dependent on Donations

- Our Diaper Pantry no longer has funding to purchase diapers to assist families with this financial need.
- Since January 2025 we have served 37 families - some once, some every month, who speak 6 different languages and live in 9 of our 11 towns.
- Families must register with us and qualify for WIC, SNAP, childcare subsidy, subsidized housing, or have other circumstances that make their financial situation unstable.
- As part of the registration process, we refer families to other benefits programs they may be eligible for.
- Some of our diaper pantry clients have enrolled in our PC+ home visiting program for more parent support and early learning activities for their children.
- We thank Neighborhood Villages for their recent donation!

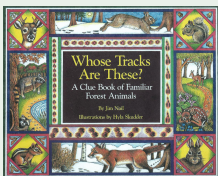
